Objective	What it looks like
To research two interpretations of an event, identifying differences between them.	Examine different written and oral versions of an event in Viking/British history. Give explanations as to why the accounts vary, justifying why this may be – hero or villain.
To use historical sources to understand one-sided and contrasting arguments.	Examine a significant individual: Ivar the Boneless. Analyse and examine the prominence of differing points of view from historical accounts, considering how people viewed Ivar the Boneless.
To explain how significant events have helped shape the country we have today.	Examine the impact the Vikings had upon Britain. Are there lasting consequences of Viking migration still in modern society? Detail the cultural and social impact. Is there evidence of what happened?
To explain the migration of Viking invaders.	Examine the movement of Viking people over time – local area, globally. Analyse the perspective of the Vikings and why they migrated – use maps to support this. Explain the reasons that people migrate.
To analyse the social impact of migration: were Vikings welcomed by the British?	Examine a significant individual: Ivar the Boneless. Evaluate and interpret how historical relationships between the Vikings and the Britains were during this period in time.
