Objective	What it looks like
To understand how information in a database is organised and the advantages of a computer database over a paper one.	Children will look at examples of computer databases and what they show. Databases will be interpreted and including how the data is categorised. Children will look at the advantages and disadvantages of computer and paper based databases.
To find and enter information to create additional records in a database.	Children will be given the basis of a database and asked to fill in the numerical information. From this, the data can be interpreted. Children will have experience using databases such as Microsoft Excel to complete databases.
