

# Our History curriculum.

#### **EYFS**

At Greenpark Academy our EYFS history curriculum is developed to facilitate our children's understanding of where they are as a part of history – within living memory. All history is looked at from the starting point of where their life is in a historical context and, with adult guidance, children are given opportunities to recognise and give perspective e.g. 'Is this in your life time or before?' Making generational comparisons with the experiences of parents and grandparents, our children are able to communicate their understanding of the past.

Our children in EYFS follow the same overarching umbrella themes as whole school – including quest questions – with all learning activities being centered on the themes, including reading, fine motor etc.

#### **Understanding the World**

- Comment on images of familiar situations in the past.
- Compare and contrast characters from stories, including figures from the past.

### ELG: understanding the world - Past and Present

Children at the expected level of development will:

- Talk about the lives of the people around them and their roles in society.
- Know some similarities and differences between things in the past and now, drawing on their experiences and what has been read in class.
- Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class and storytelling.
