Unit: How does Celebration bring a community together?

Overview:

During this sequence of learning, pupils will look at the religions Christianity and Islam and the way in which celebrations can bring a community together.

What should I already know?

- There are different religions including Hinduism, Christianity and Judaism.
- There are similarities between the religions in that they all have special places of worship and holy books.
- To worship means to show deep respect towards a god or sacred object.
- Some religions like Christianity believe in one god whereas others like Hinduism believe in many gods.

What will I know by the end of the unit?


Christianity

- Baptism is a Christian ceremony.
- When someone is baptized, they become a follower of Jesus.
- Families come together to celebrate baptism.
- After the Church service, a party is usually held for families and friends to celebrate together.

Islam

- Islam is one of the world religions. It is a religion that believes in one God called Allah
- People that follow the religion of Islam are called Muslims.
- Muslims believe that Muhammad is a messenger of Allah (God).
- Muslims worship in mosques. Muslims often call the mosque by its Arabic name - Masjid.
- The Muslim holy book is called the Qur'an.
- Eid al-Fitr is a very important festival for Muslims.
- It is known as 'The Feast of Breaking the Fast' and is celebrated at the end of Ramadan.
- At Eid al-Fitr, Muslims wear their best clothes, decorate their homes and spend time with their families and friends.
- Some Muslims give money to the poor so that they can enjoy the day too.
